

Our year of impact

2019-2020

We are now considered one of the largest stand-alone, specialist sexual assault and family violence services in Victoria, with 110 employees providing support across our community. It has been through the conscientious effort and support of all our staff, our partners, clients, funders and the Board that we are a strong and proud organisation.

Through our robust governance and strong leadership, our services continued to be delivered in an environment that we have never experienced before, and where client demand continued and increased across our service areas.

While our method of supporting clients has changed during the pandemic, our annual data shows that we increased our delivery. Over 4,200 people received support across our services during the financial year, a 9 per cent increase to the previous year; including over 630 people from the Wimmera district.

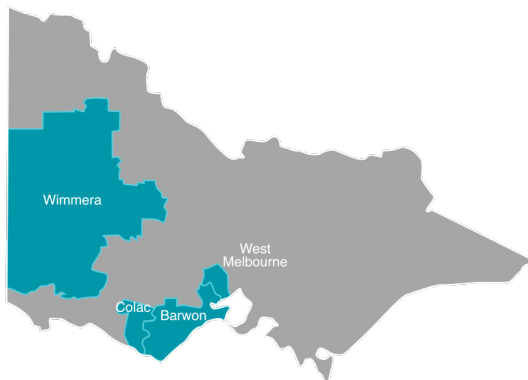

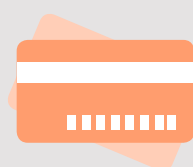
